To consider passing the following resolution in view of the sensitivity of the information contained in the Confidential Report (pink paper) for item 10: "By virtue of the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act, 1960, the press and public are excluded from discussions on the following item(s) on the basis that disclosure thereof would be prejudicial to the public interest by reason of the confidential nature of the business to be transacted." It was resolved to pass the motion, however, no members of the public were present. To consider the Confidential Report deferred from the Council meeting of the 15th 82/18.
