Introduction and Context				

Van Community Council serves approximately 2500 dwellings over Lansbury, Porset, Castle Park and Mornington Meadows in Caerphilly. The area includes Caerphilly Business Park and open countryside such as Gwern y Domen, Castle Mound, Van Mansion and Coed y Maerdy. The Council comprises of ten elected Members and one part-time staff member.

The Council owns one piece of land (acquired in 2018). Van community council successfully secured funding, through local places for nature to develop this. It is currently being managed by volunteers over a period of five years: known as -van orchard

Van Community council consistently engages and works in partnership with Van Ward allotments, local schools and the Van Community Centre.
